Thank you, Elders on Duty and Ushers, for helping us worship in safety by guiding us through the social distancing protocols and thank you, worshippers, for complying with our face mask and safety protocols. Your cooperation allows us to continue in-person worship.

Thank you, Session, for approving final year 3 of 3 gift of \$50,000.00 from our Legacy Endowment Funds to our Revitalize the Presbytery of Florida efforts. Also, for \$3,000.00 Legacy gift to purchase Apple Macintosh desktop computer and video studio software and hardware to enhance our worship and church audio/video broadcast capabilities.

Thank you, anonymous Church Member, for your gift of \$100,000.00 to replace our analog sound system in the sanctuary with state-of-the-art all digital sound and video system and cameras to enhance the sound quality in our sanctuary for our choirs and musicians. We will be equipped to present high quality sound worship services, music programs, and general presentations our sanctuary and to record and broadcast and video programs of the caliber as we recorded last summer up. We hope to install the equipment in November. We need and want folks to be trained in operations of the system. If interested, contact Clara Riggleman.

Thank you for showing mutual forbearance after the November 3 presidential election. This presidential election 2020 has been contentious, to say the least, and some church members are expressing harsh feelings and vitriolic language on social media platforms. Let us show mutual forbearance to one another after November 3 election day and not gloat over our side winning, whichever "side," party, camp, that may be. Let us demonstrate grace and respect to one another and pray for cooperation to prevail as our nation responds and moves into 2021.

Thank you, Hurricane Recovery Efforts. Reroofing of our buildings (\$305,000.00) is underway, replacements of wet ceilings and carpets in the Activity Center will begin soon, repairs to the playground/plaza are underway, repairs in TLC wing are done. Estimated total cost of repairs is \$340,000.00, with insurance deductibles of \$152,000.00 (wind) and \$2500.00 (flood). Deductibles will be covered by the emergency fund we established after 2004 Hurricane Ivan and to which we deposit each year. We hope insurance policies will pay the balance.

Thank you, Christmas Offering. The Session approved replacing the PCUSA Christmas Offering with an offering to the Escambia County Long Term Recovery Committee (LTRC) to provide assistance to local citizens recovering from losses to Hurricane Sally. In 2018 we did the same switch and provided assistance to Panama City – Parkway Presbyterian Church after Hurricane Michael. We will collect the special offering on Sunday, December 20, please submit your gifts to Sharon Robbins in the church office by December 20.
