
Are you ready to Rock and Roll?

Summer is about to give way to our Fall 2019 schedule and we have much in the works!



RALLY DAY SUNDAY August 25 Sunday School Fall Semester begins.

Come enjoy our pancake breakfast at 8:45AM and hear about children, youth, and adult educational plans. Sign up for new classes and offerings.



EDUCATION WING RENOVATIONS BEGIN NEXT WEEK: July 29-August 9 our preschool will close for two weeks for renovations to nursery rooms, classrooms, and bathrooms. Much needed electrical updates, new light fixtures, new flooring, and painting begin our 4-phase renovations in 2019 and 2020. We will address needs in four classrooms and both the public and classroom bathrooms, some of which have not been updated since the building was

built in the 1960's. TLC preschool will be using the restrooms in the church narthex during construction. The project is expected to take four weeks, some work will be completed after TLC reopens August 12 by consolidation and cooperation for a brief period. How exciting to make progress! This first phase will be funded from Legacy Funds and Restricted Funds.

Renovations to the remaining classrooms, hallway, and children's church room are scheduled for May/June 2020, and the final phase upgrades to TLC Office and Workroom and exterior breezeway are scheduled for later in 2020. We will conduct a Capital Funds drive in 2020 to accommodate these renovations.



SMALL GROUP "BOOK TASTING" AUGUST 11 AFTER WORSHIP. Our Small Group ministry is expanding for 2019-2020, and we invite you to come see what is planned for the entire year September 2019 to May 2020. See the books and resources planned for use and enjoy tasty treats in the parlor.

A congregation-wide emphasis on discipleship will run September -October 2019, then in January 2020 we will focus congregation wide on Bible knowledge. An Advent Study opportunity will occur November-December. Our third congregation-wide emphasis on Prayer in March-April 2020 will use the intriguing method of "Draw the Circle" for forty days of prayer for Lent. After Easter, a short term discipleship/Bible exploration will be offered. June-July 2020 will focus on the Three S's: social gatherings, service projects, and short-term studies. With this intentional plan, we will offer you varied paths to meet new people in the church, varied experiences, and varied approaches to personal spiritual development that will foster your life in Christ and in our congregation! Come "taste and see that the Lord is good" and that our life together is delicious too!

Adam Hamilton, senior pastor of the 22,000 member United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, Kansas, the largest church in the denomination, lists nine qualities of an effective pastor in his book, Leading Beyond the Walls, Developing Congregations with a Heart for the Unchurched. Frank Beall has exhibited these qualities through an extraordinary sixty years of ministry.

Integrity: is defined as discerning what is right and wrong and acting on what you have discerned. Over the years, Frank has addressed social problems that cried out for biblical and theological influence. He has given sermons on prayer in public schools, race issues, abortion, homosexuality, racism, right to die. His motivation was not to get people to adhere to his views but to provide a perspective of how to view them. Four of the sermons on issues were discussed in small groups at Wednesday night suppers.

Humility: Frank sees himself as a servant of the church and of others. He would like to be remembered as faithful to Jesus Christ, to his wife, family, the churches he served, to his friends, and communities where he has lived, and to his country.

Passion: Frank makes no effort to conceal his passion for Alabama football, especially from Auburn friends. He is passionate about physical fitness from tennis, running, and golf in his younger years, and now lap swimming. His

first passion, however, is pastoral care with a gift for remembering names and making others feel important. His passion for reading keeps him abreast of issues of the day and has informed sermons on timely topics.

Vision: When Frank arrived as the new minister in 1971, Trinity had 350 members and was not involved in the community. He held a retreat for the session and formed a long range planning committee which set three goals: the church would become involved in community service, would be opened for meetings of community groups, and when Trinity had 600 members, a new church would be started. These goals were achieved and changed the philosophy of the church which continues to this day.

Perseverance: In the mid 80's, the Session discussed planting another new church versus renovating the building and adding an addition. It was decided that both could be done. This was a key moment in Trinity's history. Northminster Church was planted with fifty Trinity members going to help form the new congregation on Nine Mile Road, the activities center was built, and administrative area and sanctuary were renovated.

Decisiveness and Risk Taking: Frank felt the call to ministry in junior high school. He grew up in a home where the Baptist church was a big part of their lives and attended Baylor University, going on to graduate from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. His first call was as an associate to First Baptist Church in Columbus, Georgia, a 2800 member congregation. When the senior minister left, they turned the church over to him and at age 26, he was head of staff for eleven months. It became clear to him that he did not fit into the Baptist denomination with its conservative and fundamental beliefs. He was drawn to Presbyterianism and tried it out by attending Columbia Seminary in Decatur, Georgia, for a year and was welcomed and found a fit with the style of worship and social outlook. He was called to Henry Memorial Presbyterian Church in Dublin, Georgia, where he met Sylvia, who would become his wife. Frank looks back with pride that he had a good beginning in ministry at First Baptist in Columbus.

Being Purpose-driven: One of Frank's biggest influencers was E. Stanley Jones, an American 20th-century Methodist missionary and theologian. Jones believed that Jesus was the agent of creation, which meant that God's laws could not be broken and that the way of grace and forgiveness was built into the universe. Frank read most of what Jones wrote.

Communication Skills: Frank has the ability to preach and interpret scripture in ways that people understand, making the Bible relevant to current social and economic issues. He adapted to the sound bite world, making sermons short and to the point.

Encouragement and Mentoring: Frank feels that nothing takes the place of good pastoral care. It is the key to every effective ministry. People want to know that they are loved and cared for. One way that Frank extended encouragement and mentoring, following retirement from his 26 year ministry at Trinity in 1997, was to serve nine different congregations in Alabama and Florida as interim pastor. These were one to two year placements as head of staff for churches searching for a new pastor. His role as interim was to help churches get through the transitional time and to reassure them during the process, sharing what he had learned in his years of ministry.

A Personal Relationship with Jesus Christ: When asked what words of wisdom he would pass on to his great grandchildren, Frank replied that through all the changing circumstances, the one constant is Jesus. Frank has seen the race issue come to a head, the hippie culture, space age, Korea, Vietnam, ordination of women, gays and lesbians. These have happened during his years of ministry yet there is one constant. Jesus is the way, the truth, the life, the same yesterday, today and forever. When Frank meets God he will thank Him for his life, Sylvia, children, friends and all the opportunities he has had.

Thank you, Frank, for faithfulness in 60 years of ministry.


Spiritual Seekers Becoming Transformed Believers .


Overcoming immeasurable adversity in their young lives, Pace girls redefine the meaning of courage and strength as they make positive strides in pursuit of their goals and dreams.

Protection for missionaries when they show the film in areas that can be hostile to the gospel.

Also, safety for those who make a decision to turn from Islam and follow Christ!


