PONDERING TRINITY AS A POST-PANDEMIC CHURCH:

We are in "Post-Sally Pensacola" time now; the hurricane has passed, but still we are picking up the pieces. We are not in a post-pandemic era yet; the COVID-19 experience continues to re-shape our world and our worldview. These disruptions give pause to reconsider our circumstances and ministries. I've been reading pundits' perceptions of trends in being the church in a post-pandemic world. Here are some of my musings these days. I will explore more in upcoming sermons.

TRINITY DAMAGE AND RECOVERY: Hurricane Sally damaged our roofs and soaked our floors. Our wind and flood insurance policies will help cover the damages. We look toward new roofing on all our buildings: Activity Center, Sanctuary, Preschool Wing, Education Wing, and Administration Area. New ceiling panels and carpet in upstairs Gym classrooms and Room 11 downstairs. New playground sunscreens to replace broken and damaged structures, several sound absorbing panels on gym walls, and other incidentals. Insurance adjusters have visited us: we are awaiting word on application results.

MASTER BUILDING PLAN: TRINITY REIMAGINED! As COVID-19 shut us down, we were nearing completion of work with area architects to envision better utilization of Trinity's buildings and grounds, using your 103 ideas at our visioning workshops last winter. Working from our inputs, the Quina- Grundhoeffer Architectural firm of Pensacola created an exciting, dramatic, ambitious, vision of Trinity's facilities! We will share that conceptual plan with you as we get back together and explore the scale of renovation that we may undertake with a Capital Funds campaign. How we envision our ministries shapes our facility's future. Is this the best or worst time to consider a major renovation? Are we in a positive position to focus on the future, or do we focus on just getting back into our ministries?

THE POST-PANDEMIC CHURCH: Larry Tomczak equates our eventual return after the pandemic to Noah and his family exiting the ark to a new world, a new era. "After the flood everything changed. After World War II everything changed. After 9/11 everything changed. After the Corona Crisis everything will change. Economy. Professional Sports, Health Care. Hollywood. Jobs. School. Travel. Childcare. Shopping. Youth Athletics. Campaigning. Restaurants. Military. Entertainment. Elections. College. Cruises. Funerals. Church. All have been impacted dramatically and permanently. There is no going back, constant change is here to stay." (Tomczak, Larry. *The Post Pandemic Church.* ChurchGrowth.org)

Hugh foresees:

Months of separation reinforced that BEING the church is more important than GOING TO church. The church is not a building but a body. We'll rediscover the importance of our mission and our connections. The church is not built on services but on relationships (Acts 2:42-47).

Our Facilities and spaces will be multi-purpose. Our facilities may become a hub for community workshops and seminars on Christian living and lifestyle needs, service, and discipleship.

We will increase our multimedia capabilities. We have expanded our social media presence tremendously. I envision the day Trinity employs a media specialist on staff.

Both in-person and virtual gatherings are here to stay. Worship services, small group gatherings and committee/team meetings will offer both in-person and virtual options for participation.

Church programming will offer weekday opportunities, not just Sundays.

Thirst for Good News and Discipleship: People are anxious for healing, helpful, positive good news and life transformation. Training in habits of discipleship that we may replicate in others and Christian mentors will propel our ministry helping people to adopt the Jesus way of life.

I look forward to our future in post-pandemic years!


