Phase 1	Worship	Other Ministries
Important Dates	 In-person worship begins on Sunday, September 20, 2020 at 10:30am. Doors opened at 10:00am Service live-streamed (broadcast) via www.Trinitypcola.org. 	 Online Sunday school continues. In-person Sunday school will resume at a later date. Other adult small groups may meet. Go to https://mytrinity.ccbchurch.com/ to schedule a meeting and room.
Children	No Children's church and nursery.	 Children and youth Sunday school will resume at a later date. Vacation Bible School cancelled.
Guidelines	 Wearing a mask is required. Social distancing guidelines of 6ft will be followed for seating; families may be seated together. Socializing before or after church is encouraged outside the building. Maximum seating 150 in the sanctuary; 15 in the parlor. Hand sanitizer stations are present throughout the church building. No common-touch items or Holy Communion at this time. 	 Rooms must be scheduled through https://mytrinity.ccbchurch.com/ Rooms are available for church related events only. Rooms available are Parlor, Prayer Room, and Rooms B,D,E, and F. Disinfectant Cleaning is required before and after room use by the group using the room. Guidelines for disinfecting rooms are posted in each room. Social distancing guidelines of 6ft is expected within the church building.
