Let's Celebrate - Trinity Learning Center is 20 Years Old!

"Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it."
Proverbs 22:6 (NIV)

During the week, Trinity Learning Center (TLC) is thriving and alive with activity! As you walk down the TLC hall, bright colors and creative art abounds; voices of joyful children and the developing lungs of the smallest infants are heard through closed doors. If you take time to stroll outside, you encounter the laughter of children and see amazing physical activity on the Legacy Playground. If you are really lucky, you might even observe the faces of amused young children riding around the parking lot in the *Bye Bye Buggy*. Every day is different, but every day at TLC focuses on a Christian based curriculum offered in a nurturing, loving and safe environment.

When established in 1999, TLC's mission was to be a Children's Ministry with pre-school and after school programming for church families and the surrounding community. It was established to offer a safe and loving environment where children grow spiritually, intellectually, physically, socially, and emotionally. Twenty years later, the core belief of TLC remains the same -- in order to develop the highest possible self-esteem, children must become aware of God and His importance in their lives and this knowledge will help them grow as children of God.

Today, TLC serves 80 families whose children's ages range from 8 weeks old to pre-kindergarten. Daily care and support is provided by 19 staff members and weekly chapel is offered by Hugh or Brian. TLC children are invited to Vacation Bible School and are also included in TPC's annual Trunk or Treat celebration. In turn, Trinity members are invited to TLC plays and performances, the annual gingerbread house making extravaganza and the end of year, ever- emotional TLC graduation. Wendy Davies said, "Attending the TLC graduation is always one of the most special and moving events I experience all year."

The twenty year impact of TLC is immeasurable. Hundreds of children have experienced this loving, caring environment. TLC has changed their lives, as well as those of their parents. Allison Jones said, "With teachers and administrators oozing with patience, kindness and creativity, TLC has been more than we could have ever wished for our girls' social, intellectual and spiritual education. ...TLC is an unbelievable blessing that gives children a foundation for learning, a foundation for kindness and a foundation for the soul." Christian and Sheree Garman added, "...the biggest gift our daughters gained from TLC is *confidence*. They learned to believe they are smart and capable and that they should accept a challenge and embrace it. That foundation has served them well and will serve them every day in whatever challenges they face, school or otherwise. We are grateful for TLC, its wonderful teachers and responsive leadership."

The 20th Anniversary of TLC will be celebrated on September 8th. Teachers and staff, along with TLC families and children will be invited to church on this momentous day. A special reception will follow in the parlor. Join us as we celebrate this wonderful ministry and take time to thank those who make it such an outstanding center today.

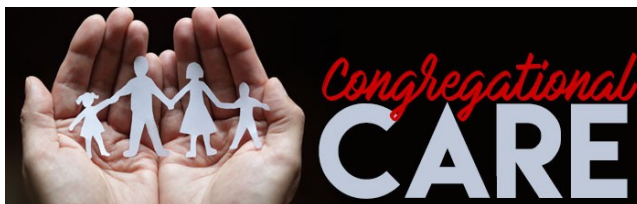

Jesse Digges, founder of Send56 and partner of Etta and Will Shehee who are Trinity's missionary partners in Tororo, Uganda, met with a gathering of supporters in Mary Catherine and Andrew Hinton's home on August. 5. He expressed appreciation for the \$147,000 Trinity legacy grant in 2016, and gave an update on the fruit of that grant and the future of Send56. The legacy grant was matched with funds from other sources and used to build Send56's first missionary training school in Tororo, Uganda, where Will is the director. The school can house 90 people.

Jesse was raised in upstate New York, married at 18 and moved to Uganda at 23 and has lived in Africa for thirteen years. He has had a personal calling to reach Muslims with the gospel since age 18. Send56 exists to reach the 900 unreached people groups in Africa focusing in rural areas where Western missionaries are not likely to be. While there are more Christians in Africa than in the US, there are 450 million who need the gospel and the majority are Islamic tribes.

Send56 succeeds by establishing missionary training schools and centers for prayer. Missionaries must have the wisdom and training to navigate with Muslims, know what to say that they can believe and how to do missions among unreached rural people who are predominantly Muslim. New converts have difficulties as they are expelled from their families and it is a challenge to disciple them. The strategy is house churches that multiply, focusing on making disciples who then reach their families and more people, similar to early Christians who met in homes for 200 years following the crucifixion of Christ.

Send 56 values:

- Empowering native missionaries: Many Send56 missionaries have lived in mud huts and know the culture and people. They can adjust to the environment.
- Proclamation of the gospel: Faith comes by hearing and hearing comes from the word of Christ. Romans 10:13: "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." The Word is first. Send56 trains and supports preachers of the gospel.
- Prayer: It undergirds everything Send56 does. Send 56 has prayer morning through evening.

Every year new missionaries are being sent and there are now 36 missionaries strategically placed in five countries. Their goal is to gather disciples. They begin in church homes, develop friendships, do outreach, share the gospel, live among them and pray for them. It is frontline church planting and missionaries are the first pastors. Romans 10:14-15 "How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news." It costs \$400 per month to send a missionary.

The second missionary training school will be established in Isiolo, Kenya, where Jesse lives with his family. Phase 1 is the purchase of 2 ½ acres which is done, phase 2 is prayer, phase 3 will be construction of a missionary training school similar to the one in Tororo. The Send56 goal over the next 30 years is to have 10 training schools and 4000 missionaries sent to the 900 unreached people groups.

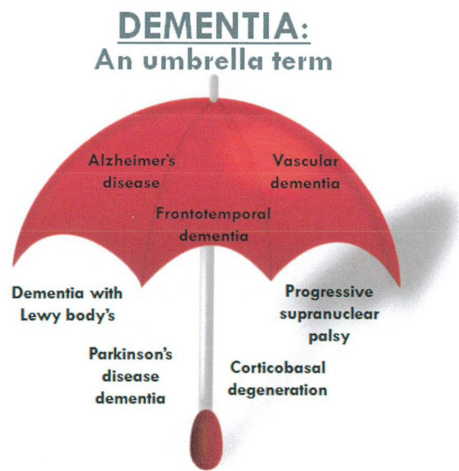
